ESSAY I.

1. You are the legal counsel of Telecom Italy, which is entirely owned by the government. The President calls you to her office. Telecom Italy is planning to merge its phone and telecommunications services with France Telecom. France Telecom is a semi-public company whose shares trade on the stock market, but the government still owns 65 percent of the company. In its home country, France Telecom is a major supplier of Internet access and the third leading provider of cable television service. Prepare a legal opinion addressing the key steps that will need to be taken to get the merger approved.

ESSAY II.

2. Garth Nader, your law school roommate, has been elected as the President of Fonostan, a country of 15 million people in Asia that is classified as a least-developed country by the United Nations. Nader has asked you to recommend a new reform plan for the Fonostan phone system, which is presently an entirely state-owned monopoly under the Ministry of Posts and Telegraph. Prepare a legal opinion for Nader, discussing the key features, advantages and disadvantages of your proposed regulatory system, including the structure and function of the regulatory body.

ESSAY III.

3. The Minister of Telecommunications of Pluto, a country in Latin America, is angry and has come to consult you. He has just received a formal notice from the Federal Communications Commission informing him that accounting rates on all phone traffic between your countries will be reduced by 20 percent effective immediately. Pluto is a member of the ITU and the World Trade Organization (WTO) and its phone service is provided by a government-owned monopoly. Please prepare an opinion advising the Minister as to the options can Pluto take at the national and international level to contest this action

ESSAY IV.

You are a lawyer with the ITU. The Secretary-General has received a letter from Kurdistan seeking to become a Member State of the ITU and to obtain a Country Code for its phone system. Prepare a legal opinion for the Secretary-General, advising him as to how he should respond to the request.
