
Title: "We Can Abolish Depressions"

Question: Division of opinion as to number of registrations required.

Application has been submitted on form C, accompanied by a copy which is the subject of the division of opinion in this case. Correspondent points out that in the first part the problem is stated and in the second part the solution is reached, frequently by the question and answer method. He states that the lecture in the present form has been given some six times and the work is as nearly complete as can be prepared.

In the opinion of the examiner two registrations are required: one for Part I,--The Cause; and Remedies That Have Failed--the problem stated; and the other, Part II,--The Solution: Force Idle Money to Work--the solution. Mrs. Brady supports the examiner in this recommendation. Mr. Wise, Mr. Smith, and Mr. Pierce, on the other hand, take the position that a single lecture has been presented. According to the letter in support of the application it is understood that the material submitted is the subject of delivery during one evening and one part is incomplete without the other. In view of these circumstances it is their opinion that one registration is adequate and this action should be taken upon receipt of the registration fee.

MEMORANDUM

Title: "Microscopic Examination of Dairy Products and Their Calculations" or "Bacteria Per Cub. Cent. in Thousands in Dairy Products."

Question: Division of opinion as to adequacy of title, application and notice.

The work which is the subject of this memorandum is a contribution to a newspaper or periodical. The article is entitled "Microscopic Examination of Dairy Products and Their Calculations," and in it there is a technical drawing which illustrates the text. The copyright notice in the following form "Hans Edel--Copyright Dec. 1939" has been placed under the technical drawing, whereas the application filed gives the title not of the technical drawing but of the entire article. The applicant in his application on form A5 describes the material as "print."

In the opinion of the examiner correspondence should be conducted with the request that a new application be filed giving the title of the drawing only. Mrs. Brady supports the examiner in her recommendation. On the other hand, Mr. Wise, Mr. Smith and Mr. Pierce feel that registration should be made as applied for. The title given identifies the material for which copyright protection is desired, and the Index Section by following the copy can remove any possible doubt as to identification. A further fact is of some importance in that the copyright notice covers not merely the drawing but also the entire article. In view of these circumstances, there is, in the opinion of the three members named above, no reason for conducting correspondence. Registration in their opinion should be made as applied for.
